Manchester Histories Festival will return for its 9th edition in June 2024. The festival will be a special celebration as we will join forces with the University of Manchester and Manchester Metropolitan University as they mark their 200th anniversaries.

The bicentenary of each university will focus on celebrating the difference the Universities have made to the city of Manchester, the country, and the world, recognising the achievements of its people, staff, students, donors, alumni, and external partners.

Manchester Histories will also hold a two-day open mic extravaganza at Manchester Central Library, where people from across Greater Manchester will have the chance to share their own unique stories about the histories and heritage that matter to them.

Background on Manchester Histories

Manchester Histories is an award-winning charity that works collaboratively to reveal, share and celebrate Greater Manchester's diverse histories and heritage. We connect people to explore the past and shape the future through histories and heritage.

We are proud to celebrate the diversity, creativity, ingenuity and social principles of the people of the ten Greater Manchester districts. Our engagement with histories and heritage empowers people, both as creators and audiences, by recognising and valuing their stories. We develop our work in partnership with communities, academics, volunteers, artists, and organisations, so our work manifests itself in response to the people we work with and for.

As a result, Manchester Histories creates work that is innovative, creative and different. We deliver a yearlong public and community engagement programme and host the biennial Manchester Histories Festival.

Festival Producer role:

Manchester Histories is seeking an experienced, self-motivated and enthusiastic festival producer to deliver Manchester Histories Festival 2024.

Key experience:

- Experience of working on festival/s in a producing role is essential
- Ability to work under pressure and meet deadlines
- Able to work effectively as part of a team and independently
- Effective line management experience
- Excellent communication skills

Contract: Freelance. Flexible hybrid working is in place but must be available two weeks before the festival starts and be onsite over the festival period. 6th-9th June 2024. Also, be available on the Monday 10th June 2024 for any get out requirements.

Job Requirements:

- The Festival Producer will take the lead responsibility for the successful delivery of the festival, including the preparatory work, evaluation and planning from January 2024.
- You will work closely with the CEO, Freelance Communications Manager and the Programming Team at The University of Manchester and other partners to deliver a successful Manchester Histories Festival 2024.

Job Responsibilities:

- Artist/Freelance Liaison: Including confirming professional companies, issuing contracts, completing required paperwork, tech specs and RAMS, booking accommodation and supporting companies in making their travel arrangements.
- Project Management: Including working closely with the festival team and other colleagues to ensure the safe planning and delivery of the festival's activity.
- Programme: Supporting the programme of events, Celebration Day event in Whitworth Hall, activity in the festival performance tent, onsite at UoM. Supporting Freelance Comms Manager with programme – getting copy detail/activity ready for programme
- Round table Programme Support the CEO in programming the talks and discussions for Sunday 9th June 2024

- Opening Evening: Supporting the CEO with the planning of the night at Whitworth Art Gallery
- Evaluation, Reporting and Implementing Learning: Use Manchester Histories Evaluation framework to organise and gather feedback from participants and audience members at the festival
- Volunteers: Working with the project manager to recruit volunteers to support the festival activity
- Sustainability: Ensure the festival operates within Manchester Histories environmental policies
- Using a number of software tools such as Mailchimp, WordPress, Sling to manage audiences and volunteers
- Produce a festival report with CEO

How to apply:
